

Curriculum Document for Language Arts

Course Title: Grade: 1

Learner Objective #1: Students will demonstrate an understanding of proper speaking and listening skills as evidenced through student speaking during class discussions and show and tell.

State Standards Addressed:

- Demonstrate ability to take turns
- Listen to and follow series of three directions
- Tell about a personal experience or item speaking in complete sentences

Learner Objective #2: Students will demonstrate an understanding of the written alphabet as evidenced by individual and group written assignments.

State Standards Addressed:

- Write capital letters
- Write lower-case letters
- Place letters and words in ABC order

Learner Objective #3: Students will learn about words as evidenced by individual and group written and verbal assignments.

State Standards Addressed:

- Identify beginning sounds and letters of words
- Identify rhyming words
- Identify words with meanings that are alike
- Identify opposites
- Identify color words

Learner Objective #4: Students will understand how to write a complete sentence as evidenced through journal writing and dictation.

State Standards Addressed:

- Identify naming parts of sentences
- Identify telling parts of sentences
- Identify two kinds of sentences (asking and telling)
- Write a telling sentence
- Write an asking sentence

Learner Objective #5: Students will demonstrate an understanding of naming words as evidenced through written and oral drills.

State Standards Addressed:

- Find naming words in written and oral language (introduction of nouns)
- Identify naming words that name one and more than one
- Identify special naming words that require capitalization (introduction of proper nouns)
- Use I and Me correctly in written and oral language

Learner Objective #6: Students will demonstrate an understanding of doing words as evidences through written and oral drills.

State Standards Addressed:

- Find doing words in written and oral language (introduction of verbs)
- Identify special doing words: am, is, are (present tense forms of TO BE)
- Identify doing words with one or more (subject-verb agreement)
- Identify doing words that tell about now or the past (present and past tenses)
- Identify special doing words that tell about the past: was, were (past tense forms of TO BE)
- Identify doing words that change to tell about the past: does/ did; goes/ went (past tense forms of irregular verbs)

Learner Objective #7: Students will become aware of the basic mechanics of written language as evidenced through 6+1 trait writing and written and oral drills.

State Standards Addressed:

• Identify two types of paragraphs: descriptive and narrative

- Identify parts of and write a letter
- To use details in writing a description
- To order events in chronological order
- To develop a story ending from given events (predicting)
- To write a one-paragraph composition
